PARENTAL/GUARDIAN GENERAL RELEASE AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

This Parental/Guardian General Release and Indemnity Agreement (the "Release") is between _____, the parent and/or lawful guardian (the "Guardian") of _____ (the "Minor(s)") and the Korean Culture Camp of Eastern Michigan, Inc., a Michigan Nonprofit Corporation whose principal place of business is 848 Beech St., Lake Odessa, MI 48849 (the "KCC").

In consideration for participating in and receiving the benefits of the Korean Culture Camp, (the "Camp") from June 21, 2010 through June 25, 2010, at St. Thomas Aquinas School, 915 Alton Rd., Lansing, MI 48823, I, the Guardian, hereby state and agree as follows:

1. Guardian agrees to pay the amount below for Minor's(s) participation in the Camp, and in so doing Guardian acknowledges that Minor(s) is authorized to participate in the Camp and to engage in and benefit from all activities incident to the Camp;
2. Guardian acknowledges that by allowing Minor(s) to participate in the Camp, Minor(s) may appear in KCC's promotional materials, including but not limited to appearing on KCC's website, and Guardian agrees and consents to the usage of the images of Minor(s), whether in photographs or in video, in KCC's promotional materials;
2.1 "Promotional materials" Defined: for the purpose of this Release, the term "promotional materials" include, but is not limited to, photos, videos, DVDs, brochures, flyers, and other written communication, created and used for the purpose of promoting the understanding of KCC and participation of its Camp, facilitating fundraising of resources, financial and other, and community support, and assisting in the process of recruiting teachers and volunteers who plan, organize, and conduct the yearly Camp for KCC.
3. Guardian further acknowledges the potential risks and hazards connected with being on the premises and participating in the activities in the Camp, and that there may be risks and hazards unknown that may arise from entering upon the premises of the Camp or participating in the activities including, but not limited to, those listed on Exhibit A of this Release;
4. Guardian voluntarily elects to authorize Minor(s) to enter upon the premises of the Camp and engage in the aforementioned activities and any other activities that may be offered at the Camp;
5. Guardian agrees to release, waive, discharge and covenant not to sue KCC, its officers, servants, agents, employees and volunteers (hereinafter the "Releasees") from any and all liability, claims, demands, actions and causes of action whatsoever arising out of or relating to any loss, damage or injury that may be sustained by Minor(s) or to any property belonging to Minor(s), whether caused by Releasees' negligence or otherwise as long as the Releasees acted in good faith, while participating in the Camp, or while in, on or upon the premises where the Camp is being conducted, while in transit to or from the premises, or in any place or places connected with the Camp;
6. Guardian further agrees to voluntarily assume full responsibility for any risks of loss, property damage or personal injury that may be sustained by Minor(s) or any loss or damage to the property owned by Minor(s), and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Releasees from any loss,

liability, damage or costs they may incur due to Minor's(s) participation in the Camp, whether caused by the negligence of any or all of the Releasees, or otherwise as long as the Releasees acted in good faith; and

Guardian expresses the intent that this Release shall bind the members of his or her family and spouse, if Guardian is alive; and bind his or her heirs, assigns and personal representative, if Guardian is deceased; and the Release shall be deemed as a release, waiver, discharge and covenant not to sue the above named Releasees.

In signing this Release, Guardian acknowledges and represents that:

- A. Guardian has read the foregoing release, understands it, and signs it voluntarily as Guardian's own free act and deed;
- B. The terms of this Release shall be construed as the entire agreement and may not be altered, amended, modified except in writing and signed by Guardian and a KCC representative, such as its director or officer;
- C. The invalidity or unenforceability of any particular provision of this Release shall not affect the other provisions, and this Release shall be construed in all respects as if the invalid or unenforceable provisions were omitted; and
- D. Guardian executes this Release for full, adequate and complete consideration fully intending to be bound by same.

Camp activities, per **Paragraph 3 & 4** of the Release include but are not limited to the following:

1. Presentation on Traditional Korean Mud House;
2. Korean cooking class;
3. Ga-ya-gum lesson on how to play Korean traditional harp;
4. Arts & Crafts – variety of arts and crafts related to Korean culture for young children, and advanced Korean art classes for youth participants, including Korean Folk storytelling and paper folding (origami) activities related to the story;
5. Korean Culture lectures to teach children traditional and modern Korean culture and aspects of Korea in the past and present;
6. Adoption panel discussion;
7. Tae Kwon Do lesson;
8. Traditional Korean dance lesson;
9. Korean Language lessons through creative Drama and Plays;
10. Sa Mul Nori (Korean Drumming) lessons on how to play Korean drums;
11. Korean Games;
12. Playground/Snack – participating children will have 1-2 opportunities to play on a school playground which has play structures and will be provided with pre-packaged snacks;
13. Korean Lunch service of a daily Korean lunch provided by volunteers;
14. Camp Store – visits to KCC’s camp store, which would include various items from Korea and snacks (mostly pre-packaged snacks purchased from local stores); and
15. Visits to the Korean Mud House construction site.
